Monterey Renaissance in process – major improvements on the way

In just the last 12 months, everything in Monterey has changed. We are about to experience the cumulative effect of years of hard work. We call it a Renaissance; others name it a giant leap forward. Meetings, discussions, plans are all coming together to mark a series of construction projects that will dramatically improve our community.

A completed N. Fremont Specific plan resulted in a State \$6.48 million dollar grant to improve bikeways, intersections and pedestrian access on N. Fremont Street. Monterey's Neighborhood Improvement Program has recommended \$200,000 of the required matching city funding to move ahead with this grant giving it the highest prior- storm drains, throughout the city.

The design is slated to finish this year with construction next year. The Monterey City Council voted to move N. Fremont to first position for PG&E underground funding, (a five year wait on that one) with \$3.6 million dollars allocated so far

Last November, Measure P passed by a 74% yes vote. Ramona is our first street to be done and repairs to the street will be done in May, and after curing, the resurfacing will follow in June. The City will be spending \$8 million dollars a year to repair streets, sidewalks and

A new project will replace the Bay newsletter. It will be a new commercial mixed-use two story building.

The Monterey Conference Center will start a two year remodeling after Thanksgiving, at \$45 million dollars.

Casanova will have two new crosswalks plus handicapped access improvements, with construction this June.

Our park BBQ area will soon have a new shade-structure: we lost some of our trees. Other improvements include new matching playground fencing.

There are several major commercial projects in construction in the same time period. Many changes and improvements are coming.

Measure P passes with a 74% yes vote --- Fixing **Monterey Streets**

The residents of Monterey have spoken, they want our streets fixed. This 4 year sunset sales tax increase of 1% will pay to have streets, sidewalks and storm drains repaired. All these projects have already been surveyed and given priority numbers.

This city has an interactive website up and current showing where construction is taking place with detailed timeframes.

www.monterey.org/fixingstreets will be able to access this information at

any time to avoid traffic congestion and delays.

Estimates are that the city will expend \$8 million dollars a year totaling \$32 million dollars in four years.

The good news is that we are going to fix this city, with the other side of the coin requiring us to use all our patience on the forthcoming traffic snarls.

The City Council asked for a short 4 year sunset clause in order to regain the You trust of the community. They acknowledge that we the citizens will be watching closely how this tax money is spent. An oversight committee of residents is currently being formed.

Our city streets have deteriorated to the 50 PCI (pavement condition index) and we now have a goal with Measure P of raising that level to 70 PCI.

This whole process will take a very long time to accomplish; everyone is finally realizing that we have let our infrastructure fall apart.

CONA 2015 Annual Meeting

The last year has been one of change. Monterey has elected three new City Council members. You have spoken and your voices have been heard. As our City Manager has stated, it is time the pendulum swings towards the residents. Our new council members are Timothy Barrett, Ed Smith and our longtime friend Clyde Roberson. Clyde has a history of serving Monterey in the past as a Councilman, Mayor and then Councilman again. Now he is serving again as our Mayor. Clyde has made a lifelong commitment to serving our community.

He is co-founder of the Neighborhood Improvement Program and led the city to establish the Visitor Accommodation Facility charter amendment. This legislation was instrumental in preventing 19 hotels, which were in the planning process, from being built on our coastline.

That Charter amendment put a halt to a proposed Hotel Grande Del Monte which would have risen five stories from the present Urgent Care near the Wharf continuing North all the way to the Kayak building, yes, across Figueroa Street, it would have walled off our waterfront from our residents. There is a blindness to greed which can destroy a community; we are fortunate to have leaders like Clyde who have the vision and courage to prevent it. If you wonder who got the Sports Center built, it was Clyde's leadership.

Clyde has been responsible for major direction changes in Monterey's history; for this and so much more we asked him to be our featured speaker. Please attend. Bring a new neighbor and let him know your opinions about Monterey and how we can make it a even better place to live and raise our families.

CONA has come a long ways since we reorganized in 1981. We have an active membership and a strong board of directors.

All of the neighborhoods have realized that neighborhood associations are absolutely necessary organizations to the health and well being of our residents.

This was very apparent when CONA responded immediately to the chemical plume report resulting in a successful fourteen year \$18 million dollar cleanup. Without this association, the board of directors and our active membership it would have been a totally different outcome.

Please mark your calendar for our annual meeting. Meet your neighbors and stay connected, that is what a neighborhood is all about.

Using the training learned in the classroom and during exercises, CERT members can assist their families and others in their neighborhood or workplace following an event when professional responders are not immediately available to help. This 21 hour instruction is Free of Charge

April 23th.was voting night and it was an all time record. All three of your representatives voted and participated that night. Many projects were sent onto the City Council for discussion and approval, here are a few examples:

- New basketball courts
- Terrace lighting and a kitchen for the Library
- Historical park in the Lower Presidio
- A new piece of play equipment for Dennis the Menace Park
- Street, drainage, and park improvements
- A Monterey water study
- A TOT lot for Oak Grove

CONA trees are decimated

It seems as though every Saturday morning you can awaken to the sound of chainsaws roaring. This seems to be the day when city employees are not on the job and so-called contractors find it the ideal time to cut down trees. We have pine tree pitch canker and whatever is happening to our coastal oaks has reached a point where it has forever changed our green skyline.

No longer can you see a green canopy as you go down our streets. Dozens of trees have been removed in the last few years. You can identify many causes;

Disease

Drought

Insect attack

New owners who do not like trees

Lack of patience in waiting for trees to recover.

The result is still the same, hundred year old trees gone and possibly replaced by a pot sized tree that has a very low chance to become full grown. This all snowballed when the city chose to close the city forestry department. Now, a few years later, we have irreparable losses to the forests of Monterey. This is Casanova **Oak** Knoll, and we are changing.


New Garden Center in Del Rey Oaks

After many different proposals, the city of Del Rey Oaks has approved and has under construction a new Garden Center at the former Golf driving range. They heard from a number of our residents whose homes are just above this area.

Everyone agrees that this is a better and less impactful use than the original RV park concept.
